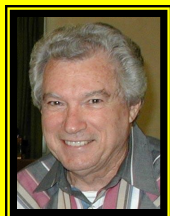

It's been a lifetime for many, but Marge was there. She remembers the meetings at the Forest Service Office buildings on the Vida Flats property. The gatherings of the members in support of the WWII effort. The Thomson's donation of the land for the current Center. The fundraisers to build the building, the dances, card games, parties, potlucks, the River Club meetings, handling the scheduling of the rental of the building, all the friends she made throughout the years. Marge did it all, she was involved.

Along with other River Club members and Marge's good friend, Buck Carter, it was decided to turn the building and property over to the community so that it could continue to be an asset to the residents of the McKenzie Valley area. But this was not the stopping point for Marge. She continued to be involved with the newly formed corporation. She took care of the renters, getting them the key to the building, checking to see that they cleaned up after using the Center. There were meetings to go to and suggestions of operations to give. When we needed help in preparing the interior of the building for painting, Marge was there moving things, cleaning and sanding. Marge has moved from the spotlight a little but you will still find her at the meetings and the offering of support is still there. We can always count on her smiling face at the monthly Bingo games at the Center.

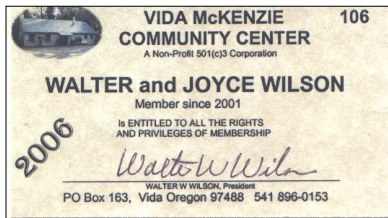

## MEMBER RENTAL REDUCTION

The Board of Directors have approved a reduced rental rate for members of the community center. The regular rental rate for non members is \$50 per day, plus a cleaning deposit of \$25.00. The reduced rate for members that wish to rent the Community Center is \$25 per day plus cleaning deposit.

## CHAIR SPONSORSHIP

The community center board asked for help and the membership overwhelming responded.

The goal of the board was to replace old "falling apart on their last leg" chairs similar to the one pictured on the right.

The Board invited VMCC members and friends of the community center to become chair donors. This was not an easy choice for the Board to consider but to move forward in a timely manner it was necessary that we seek assistance from the membership.

To this date, over 80 donations have been made toward chair purchases. This participation will help the Center achieve this goal for 2006. Each chair will have a plaque inscribed as indicated by those giving the donation.

The Board will be looking at chairs similar to the blue one on the right as an example of the commercial quality chair that will withstand the riggers of community center use. Hopefully this task will be completed in a very short time and they will be able to report to the membership in the next newsletter that the chairs will be on display at the Center.

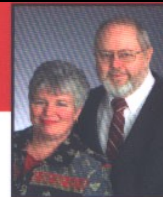
