


### Tuesday Senior Lunch is back!

**McKenzie Big Stack Tournament Debuts at VMCC**  
 On January 24, the VMCC hosted its first full-day McKenzie Big Stack poker tournament with full tables from start to finish.

Twenty-eight players took part, moving from morning warm-ups into an afternoon tournament. Participation is by suggested donation rather than an entry fee, with all proceeds supporting VMCC programs. A "double donation, double chips" option added excitement and helped raise \$405.

Players also contributed generously to the potluck, creating an incredible spread that kept everyone well fed and added to the day's community spirit.

**Winners included:**

- 3rd place: Jon Payne — \$260
- 4th place: Lisa Moore — \$75
- Best overall hand: Stu — four aces, \$50

But the day wasn't just about who won. Players highlighted the welcoming, multi-generational atmosphere that gathers regularly on Tuesday nights and for special events.

"I was the first one out today," one player laughed, "but it didn't matter. It's just a great way to be with people and do something together this time of year."

The poker league has become more than a game — it's where friendships form, neighbors reconnect, and support for the Community Center grows.

## COMMUNITY SUPPORT: Local Food Pantries

### McKenzie River Resource Center

For many families in the McKenzie River Valley, the McKenzie River Resource Center is a steady place to turn for monthly food support. Operated by local volunteers, the center provides essential groceries in a respectful, community-focused environment.

Distribution is simple and organized. Households check in, receive a number, and pick up food based on family size, while volunteers shop, sort, and prepare items behind the scenes.

The Resource Center relies on community donations to keep shelves stocked. Current needs include pantry staples like cereal, coffee, sugar, and condiments, along with financial support to help stretch limited resources.

More than anything, the center reflects the spirit of the valley — neighbors helping neighbors in practical, meaningful ways.

### McKenzie River Food Pantry

The McKenzie River Food Pantry provides groceries and essential food items to residents across the valley, supported by dedicated volunteers and strong community partnerships.

Distribution days are active and welcoming. Residents sign in and move through a walk-through setup to select available items.

Many arrive early — sometimes bringing chairs while they wait — reflecting both the level of need and the trust people place in the pantry.

Food comes from Food for Lane County, local organizations, and individual donations. During past periods of uncertainty, the pantry saw an overwhelming outpouring of support from local residents — a reflection of the valley's generosity.

Today, that same spirit continues, ensuring neighbors have reliable access to food in a respectful, community-centered setting.


